Failure to reform

Khrushchev 1953-64

Khrushchev spoke in condemnation Of Stalin's violation Of Lenin's revolutionary laws: How the shooting dead of Eike Was proof that Stalin's psyche Was riddled with most odious flaws. **B**ut though Khrushchev took exception To bureaucrats' corruption, He failed to make effective reform; And all attempts to nurture A growing liberal culture Merely stimulated diehard scorn...

Nikita Khrushchev Had Stalin pushed off The pedestal where he stood: Said all that purging, At Stalin's urging. Had done more harm than good. The Politburo Would thence make sure no Psychopathic megalomaniac

in future could...

In Kazakhstan & South Siberia, Land was virgin but inferior Which bad management & planning made worse: While maize replacing cotton, So badly stored went rotten And put food production into reverse. **I**ndustry was veering Towards lighter engineering, Consumer goods & higher rewards; But along with chemicals & plastic, Were of Joe iconoclastic,

So with older party members,

crossed swords...

Compare with Leninism; Stalinism; Brezhnev: Gorbachev.

...K. critical of Stalinism in a speech to the duma in 1956; Stalin had ignored even aborted Lenin's dictum on personality,

...purges of the 30s condemned, so too Eike's murder

... began to take on corruption within party but found like others before & after him it was too entrenched

...almost anticipated Gorbachev here, but this too far at this stage.

...attempts to increase land for cultivation hindered by its unsuitability, ineffective preparation and inefficient management

...storage of maize inadequate so crop worthless.

...industry modernised with more attractive consumer goods but with varying success

...hardliners who regarded any moves away from the Stalinist lines of production were a criticism of him and therefore themselves

Nikita Khrushchev Had Stalin pushed off The pedestal where he stood; But though despising Collectivising. For having done no good, Despite his urgin'. Lands that were virgin Were growing less than he hoped they would...

Stalin had failed to pull down Tito, Loved & lauded by his people, With whom Khrushchev dealt with favour & tact;

But Magyars were suppressed, When tanks moved into Budapest;

And Poland forced to keep the Warsaw pact.

He'd tried to block up

But couldn't stop the

freedom planes, And stalemate was built into the Wall;

Then having sweetened Castro, Sparked the Cuban missile fiasco, When he had to order

Soviet withdrawal.

Berlin's drain

Nikita Khrushchev Had Stalin pushed off The pedestal where he stood; But took to purging Freedom emerging Where he believed he should: Then failed to sign a Treaty with China. And so the Kremlin Conspired to send him An invitation:

"Stay on vacation

for good."

Khrushchev removed while on holiday in the Crimea. ...relations with Tito in Yugoslavia were cordial, in contrast to Stalin;

...crushed Budapest movement and prevented attempt by Polish dissidents to withdraw from Warsaw pact.

...little done to prevent stream of disaffected citizens escaping to West...until wall was built

...despite US losses like Bay of Pigs & U2 incident, failed to gain Cuban missile crisis advantage when Kennedy removed US missiles from Turkey
